Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The committee amendments are adopted. We turn now to a vote on cloture. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. There has been a request for a roll call vote on the cloture. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See pages 1507-08 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 3 nays on the motion for cloture, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Cloture is successful. We immediately turn now to the advancement of LB 1351 to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. There has been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 1508 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 5 nays on the advancement of LB 1351.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1351 advances to E & R initial. Are there any items for the record?

CLERK: Madam President, amendments to LB 37 by Senator Lindsay, Senator Schimek to LB 1003, Senator Withem to LB 1224, Senator Beutler to LB 817. (See pages 1508-13 of the Legislative Journal.) Senator Withem, a priority motion, Madam President, Senator Withem would move to adjourn until 9:30 a.m., March 29.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I would like to address that motion to point out, I did...to show you what a warm open-hearted guy I am, I'm suggested we convene at nine-thirty tomorrow instead of nine to give people the opportunity to become reenergized. There was some discussion here that people would like to take advantage of the next ten minutes to return to LB 137, but I am offering this motion instead so that we can...and I did want to point out to people that we are reconvening a little bit later tomorrow morning, so with that I'd offer the motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. The motion is to adjourn until tomorrow morning at 9:30 a.m. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. We are adjourned.
