PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Bohlke wishes to announce the following guests visiting the Legislature. There are 80 twelfth graders here from Hastings Senior High School at Hastings St. Cecelia and their sponsors. Will you all please stand and be recognized. Thank you. Senator Lindsay, your light is next.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, Senator Bromm started discussing the policy of this change. And if...does anybody find it the least bit ironic that here we are trying to change something that was changed last year and we're finally talking about the policy on it? Does that disturb anybody? Does it disturb us that we made this change and coming back a year later we're finally going to talk about what that change did? We're finally hearing what was included in the bill. And are we going to start accepting this? Is anybody concerned about the process? And, yeah, we can talk about the policy and we can...we can throw out sheets that just randomly pick pedophilia as the example you use. Or I could go back and say, your bank directors, if they mess up on their license, can now get nineteen and a half years. We can do that and we can play that and do the semantical thing on it. But doesn't it bother us just a little bit that we bury a repealer in the last section of a bill? Let me ask...Senator Moore, can I ask you a question?

SENATOR LINDSAY: How much did this change cost Nebraska? How much...what's the fiscal impact of that repealer?

SENATOR MOORE: I don't...I don't know the answer to that.

SENATOR LINDSAY: And neither do I, and I bet I could talk to anybody in Appropriations Committee, I can talk to anybody on this floor, and nobody can tell us, but it doesn't bother us to pass legislation without knowing what kind of debt we're leaving for those Legislatures that will pass...that come after us. It ought to bother us. Senator Warner, I think, very appropriately passed legislation that would require a prison impact analysis. It wasn't done here. It was not done here. That ought to bother us that we don't know what it's going to do to our prisons. We just don't know. I think it's going to be huge. I
