

Well, that's part of that \$9.5 million which was extra, and what I'm suggesting to you is that here is an opportunity to fund...to do the funding for the campaign finance fund that we need to do without taking any of the reserve money that has always been there, without taking direct General Funds, and, basically, it is the same kind of removal as the removal for job training in the sense that it is a one-time removal. It is not the kind of expenditure that will require the taking out of \$300,000 or \$700,000 every year. It is a one-time removal, and it doesn't take place partially until December of 1995, and the other part in December of 1997. So it seems to me that this is a unique opportunity, a little crack, if you will, where there is extra money in the reserve fund. We need to follow through on the commitment and this is an opportunity to do it in a way which is similar to the way we have funded the job training, that is a one-time removal from that reserve fund of the unexpected money that is in there. If you do not like this proposition, LB 1003 will be in front of you in a few days, and the proposition in LB 1003 is to generate the money by taxing campaigns. So you will have an opportunity to look at that particular alternative for funding the campaign expenditure limitation law. But I think that once we've gone through these two alternatives, we have really looked at the broad array of alternatives for funding and we need to really choose one of them. And I think that probably the choice that I am giving you right now and LB 1003 represent the most logical and the best sources for funding this particular bill, this particular concept. So, with that, I think I will close and entertain questions which I will answer to the best of my ability. Thank you.
