PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 979 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 957.

CLERK: (Read LB 957 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 957 pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1669 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 38 ayes, 0 nays, 5 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 957 passes. LB 1083.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1083 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1083 pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1669-70 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 41 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1083 passes. The next item on the agenda is special order, LB 1364.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, LB 1364 was introduced by the Business and Labor Committee. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on March 10th of this year, referred to the Business and Labor Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Madam President, colleagues, LB 1364 is the annual state claims bill. The bill contains claims against the State of Nebraska which have been allowed by the State Claims Board. Due to their nature and amount they must be approved by the Nebraska Legislature. The bill includes \$29,771 in miscellaneous claims, and \$665,964 in approved tort claims.
