Senator Beutler had some questions, had some concerns, and he had prepared the two amendments that he had just withdrawn. My amendment incorporated his amendments to take care of his problem. He was concerned that the jury tampering was addressed in several different areas. It was confusing language. We did redraft that to have witness tampering, and that would include getting them to inform falsely, or to get them not to show up at all in one area, and then the tampering with the actual juror, or trying to influence the vote of a juror in a separate section. So we have combined the two statutes and the two penalties. Thank you.
