LB 833, 833A, 886, 886A, 1207A

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Excuse me, Madam President. This is simply the A bill for LB 833. It has some immediate funding in it for computer programming and initial establishment of a reporting system thereafter. It has continuing cost to implement the provisions of LB 833. The out-year costs are approximately \$50,000 a year. Looking here to see if I can find the current year's cost, but these are not General Funds, these are all borne by the retirement systems.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Any discussion on LB 833A? Seeing none, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 833A.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 833A advances. LB 886A.

CLERK: LB 886A by Senator Kristensen. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. These are funds, this is the A bill to catch up with LB 886 that we did last week. This is the study by the Bureau of Vital Statistics through the help of Senator Wesely and the Health Committee. This is a small A bill to help implement those changes and rewrite the rules and regulations. I'd ask for its adoption. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Any further discussion on the advancement of LB 886A? Seeing none, the question before the body is the advancement of LB 886A. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 886A.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 886A advances. LB 1207A.

CLERK: LB 1207A, offered by Senator Beutler. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler.
