I've never seen anything like this in my life, and I'm just flabbergasted. I...Senator Hall is kibitzing but I'll let him say it on his time. I am almost speechless, not really. And there's Senator Jones, I know he's got a deep plan for us. He's got it. Save Sweet Sue off the railroad tracks, Senator Jones; when she was trapped in an old saw mill, here come Jones. When they were going to blow her all to bits, here comes Jones, and now Jones is going to rescue Senator Coordsen and he's going to rescue LB 961 and LB 984 and I stand to be taught, and I'm going to watch, observe, and, hopefully, I'll learn, I mean, I hope I learn.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President and member, I rise to oppose the motion to suspend the rules. The issue doesn't justify it. It's plain...it's that simple. I mean, we're suspending the rules on Senator Coordsen's bill which is a consent calendar bill. I mean, think about what we're doing here. We're suspending the rules on a bill that came out of committee without any objection, was advanced over on General File with less than 15 minutes of debate, dealt with a mistake that we made in the sales tax provision a year ago, and now we're suspending the rules on it based on the Omaha city sales tax provision. I fail to see the need to suspend the rules on the issue. I understand why it's being done. I don't blame Senator Ashford for using the tools that are at his availability for purposes of dealing with this, but I just question the priority of suspending the rules on this kind of a proposal. I, for one, am not going to support the measure, do not support the Ashford measure...or the amendment, would not support the rule suspension. Thank you.
