SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, on that one, Senator Lindsay, I cannot actually say, because I don't know what the arrangement is between Douglas County and the Ak-Sar-Ben, but at one time I think it was considered an agricultural and horticultural society. There are parts of it, of its operation that are operated by the county and parts that are not.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay, thank you. I rise I guess with mixed feelings on this, and it might be something that is worthwhile. Part of what we have to do is see like what people in our counties, what they want to do. That is who is getting impacted by it, rather than being impacted at the state level. We have heard that argument here I guess time, and time again, that property taxes don't impact the state, they impact the local
