LB 72.

CLERK: LB 72, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Madam President, I move LB 72 be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor vote aye...say aye. All those opposed nay. LB 72 advances. LB 1349.

CLERK: Senator, 1349, I have E & R first of all.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, I now have an amendment from Senator Avery. Senator, this is 4510. I have a note you want to withdraw this amendment. Senator, I now have AM4448. Again, a note to withdraw on this.

SENATOR AVERY: Yes.

CLERK: Senator, I now have 4515.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Avery.

SENATOR AVERY: Thank you, Madam President, members. The two bills (sic) that we just withdrew are basically the same thing. When we took it to bill drafting we had asked, on some technical changes, to make the two mesh together. What they ended up doing is actually just putting them together. So, that is what happened and then we have now one bill (sic) to act on. The first provisions of LB 415 (sic), as it relates to LB...or to the bill, the first...and you should have on your desk a section-by-section. The first eight sections is primarily the technical and a rewrite of a lot of the provisions. It didn't make any substantial changes in what the intent that we're
