Vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chambers amendment is adopted. Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Madam President, I move LB 677A be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor vote aye. All those opposed nay. LB 677AE advances. LB 1243.

CLERK: Madam President, 1243, Senator Preister had a motion filed last evening. Senator, I understand you'd like to withdraw that amendment.

SENATOR PREISTER: That's correct, Mr. Clerk. Thank you.

CLERK: Madam President, Senators Hall and Preister would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. (Amendment, AM4586, appears on pages 1999-2000 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, and members. The amendment has been passed out to you, it's AM4586. It, for the most part, mirrors the committee amendments along with a couple of changes that Senator Preister wanted to see in those. It states that the Legislature will try to attempt to look at providing the kinds of information that we want to put on-line without a user fee, if economically feasible, and without a user fee is one of the principal issues that Senator Preister wanted incorporated in this. I feel that that's important, but I also know that there are costs associated with this kind of a transfer, a reformatting of information and then making it available. I believe that at some point in time, hopefully, at the point in time we turnkey the system, it can be available without a user fee. But I want to make sure that we don't give up that opportunity, because it may be the only way we can provide the system initially. The second provision of it, Section 20, deals with the committee to handle this. Senator Preister wanted the specific committee individuals stricken from
