

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, we're back here discussing this amendment. And I was going to...Senator Coordsen, I was going to sing a few bars of coming in on a wing and a prayer, but it was going to be coming in on a wing and a biscuit. But in order not to land us in the gravy, I'm going to withdraw that amendment.
