

decisions in here, they are going to balance to that number. And if you look at the bills we have passed, to get 11...and you can see we're \$11 million over the Governor as we speak. And the Governor is going to have to balance things out. If you look at the bills that are out there, still on the Governor's desk, there's only a very few. Obviously, LB 1087, installation labor, that's worth \$2 million a year, about \$7.5 million for the life of the sheet. That's a bill that, from a policy perspective, I don't see the Governor vetoing. You look at LB 961, the...that...I won't even...that mangled whatever it is, but it passed, and I think it's a good bill. It's one of those things that got better looking every day, so far as I'm concerned. But that's a bill that everything in there the Governor has endorsed, so he's going to sign that bill. LB 902, the other multimillion dollar bill, homestead exemption, something in the Governor's original package when he came in, in January, you know he's going to sign that one in all likelihood. And what's out there for the Governor to balance with? There's only one bill that has real dollars. Now he can veto some of these, but only one bill that has major denero that he can balance with, and that's LB 1136. And I'm not going to say what the Governor's doing, but...and I'm not going to accuse him of anything, but that's the only position he was left in because of what we did, not because of what he did, because of what...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: ...we did. We sent him a budget that was overblown that he has to veto back. And as I said many times, when we make those decisions we abdicate our responsibility over to the northeast corner. We did that willingly, knowingly, actually wantonly it appears to me, and now we have to live with it. We gave our priorities to the Governor, he sent them back to us. Unfortunately, in my opinion, though the probation officers may be a worthy cause, that's not the issue. The issue comes down to money, and because of the way we behaved all year, we do not have the money to override this veto. I urge the body to sustain it. As I said, I hope this whole veto override train stays in the station and everybody gets moving down the track. I oppose the motion to override Governor Nelson's veto.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Madam Chair. I don't want to be up
