PRESIDENT ROBAK: I'm sorry, Senator, you have a minute then.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay. Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I just wanted to tell you a little bit about the dilemma I have. I've had a number of phone calls about the probation officer increase. And I understand what Senator Pedersen is saying. I guess that the dilemma I have is when we have developmental disabilities funding on the line, it's unfortunate that that has to be the either/or and I guess I would like to know if somebody has any other inside information on if that is really the either/or. Are we doomed to take these dollars from developmental disabilities if we put this program in, or is there some other alternative? Senator Lindsay, can you answer that.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Senator Dierks. My indications are that, and I think all of you heard pretty much the same thing, that the money would...the targets that it would come from would be developmental disabilities, or LB 903, which is the judges salary bill, additional judges bill. There was another one, I can't remember it offhand what they are, but my understanding, those...
