PRESIDENT ROBAK: (Microphone not activated) ...Pastor Lynn Parsons of Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church in Omaha, from Senator Pirsch's district. Pastor Parsons.

PASTOR PARSONS: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Pastor. I now call the thirty-third day of the Nebraska Legislature to order. Will senators please record your presence.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections this morning, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any messages, reports and announcements?

CLERK: Your Committee on Government, Chaired by Senator Robinson, reports LB 46 to General File with amendments; LB 304, General File with amendments. Notice of hearing from General Affairs Committee. I have received a series of reports that will be on file in the Clerk's Office, one from the Nebraska Energy Office, the Board of Public Roads, Classifications and Standards, the Interstate Agriculture Grain Marketing Commission and the State Employees Retirement Systems. I've also received, Madam President, two communications from the State Legislatures in Montana and Idaho regarding resolutions passed there. That's all that I have this morning. PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We turn now to Final Reading. The Chair recognizes Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Madam President, members of the body, the first item before the body this morning is the procedural motion of suspending the rule. This is done quite frequently for Final Reading. Our rules say that a bill should lay over on Final Reading for two days. The Constitution requires one day. LB 830E has had the one day constitutional layover. In order to vote on the motion today, to pass LB 830E, we need to suspend the rule calling for the two-day layover. I would urge the body
