SENATOR ROBAK: They would like to have that there in fact.

SENATOR LINDSAY: No, actually Department of Corrections would determine where that goes (inaudible).

SENATOR ROBAK: They would determine that...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...the Legislature would not have any determination in where these boot camps be placed?

SENATOR LINDSAY: No, generally,...

SENATOR ROBAK: I mean how many beds?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Generally...well, how many beds, it's planned right now for 100, there would be 4 units of 25. But they'll...we wouldn't...and we don't...I think we rarely actually say where it's going to be. I don't recall how often we do that.
