PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...brass or iron knuckles only, right, at the bottom of page 10?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So we made a new law for brass knuckles and enhanced the penalty twice over, two felony provisions up for a firearm. And then we have one possession penalty in here that says...that deals with firearms and brass knuckles and we have another one that deals with brass knuckles and firearms but in addition any other deadly weapon and a knife. If we're talking about deadly weapons, doesn't it make sense to have the same parallel categories in those two different provisions?

SENATOR LINDSAY: If we're talking...you lost me there. If we're talking about...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Lindsay, do you have a second?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yeah.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Lindsay, if we can't do it any other way, are there...is there any possibility of certain sections of this bill possibly not being operative as early as other parts?
