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business entities, they are going to be able to do it, but does it provide that other loophole? Does it make an exception in there for people to do? No, and these bills have enough problems, I don't need that.

SENATOR LYNCH: Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I don't need to stick those in there, but...

SENATOR LYNCH: I just thank you, I appreciate that.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Kristensen, your light is next.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Madam President, Senator Beutler, did you have some more questions?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd yield my time, Senator Beutler, if you wanted to ask questions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Not at this point just...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. I'd waive off and answer other questions.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Madam Chairman, members of the body, Senator Kristensen, I wonder if you'd yield to some questions.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I am sorry I am in the same shape everybody else is trying to get our arms around this subject quickly. I am specifically concerned about Section 119, page 91, and the phrase that says: Without the prior approval of the district court in a proceeding in which the Attorney General has been given written notice, a public benefit or religious corporation
