SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR HILGERT: It is not as extreme as some might fear.

SENATOR BROMM: I...I'm going to just quickly finish by saying that I understand Senator Tyson's motives with the amendment. It certainly, that's a good way to approach the bill, but I will not support the amendment. But due to the policy considerations, I also won't be able to support the bill. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Crosby, on the Tyson amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: I want to talk on the Hilgert amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Tyson, you are recognized to close on your amendment. Closing has been waived. The question is the adoption of the Tyson amendment to the Hilgert amendment. All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted who care to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 6 ayes, 15 nays on the adoption of the Tyson amendment to the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Tyson amendment is not agreed to. Let me pause one second before we return to consideration of the Hilgert amendment. Would like to recognize a guest of Senator Bromm's under the north balcony. We have Mr. Orv Johnson from Wahoo. Senator McKenzie, on the Hilgert amendment.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. If Senator Hilgert would yield to a question or two.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR HILGERT: Certainly.
