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civilian that's with a concealed weapon have to do that? I think that's something that we should really take a good look at. Senator Schellpeper, I have a question for you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I had a call from a deputy sheriff and he thought that if this bill would pass, and of course he knew I was against it, but he thought that a good amendment would be that anyone that's driving a vehicle and has a concealed weapon, there should be a sticker or something...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...some type of identification on that vehicle so the policemen would be aware of that. I just wondered what your thoughts were on that?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Are they aware now if they stop someone, Senator, that they might have a weapon in there?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, I'm sure they are...you don't...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, then why would you want to have one for this, too?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, least they know there's a weapon there.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: But do they know now if that person has a weapon?

SENATOR ROBINSON: No, not really, but in this case they would know that he had a license for a concealed weapon.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: If we don't do it...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Evidently, you're not...you don't think much against...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, if we don't do it now, why would we
