SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Robinson. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I have some questions for Senator Dierks.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Dierks, would you respond?

SENATOR DIERKS: Yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: How many other states have the proposition...proposition 300 (sic) or...?

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, among our neighboring states: Minnesota, Missouri, and Iowa. And theirs is strictly enforced. South Dakota is looking at it. It will be on their election ballot, I think, this fall.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay. I have a question similar to Senator Schellpeper's. For example, all the cattle feeders up in Cuming County, the only...and most of them, you know, they'll have maybe 25 percent they feed are their own and then, you know, some will...a lot of them will feed up to 10,000. And then they have people come in and buy shares and so forth. None of those people can be incorporated. Is that correct?

SENATOR DIERKS: They can be family farm corporations.

SENATOR ROBINSON: They could be family farming corporations.

SENATOR DIERKS: But they...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Say I have a family farm corporation from Missouri Valley, Iowa. They could not come over here and buy cattle up in Cuming County or be part of their operation up there.

SENATOR DIERKS: I think...I'm not sure about that. I think the family farm corporation could, but another corporation could not.
