ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Bromm's amendment to the Coordsen amendment.

SENATOR WILL: The Bromm amendment is adopted. We are now back on the Coordsen amendment as amended. Seeing no one wishing to address it, Senator Coordsen waives closing. The question before the body now is the adoption of the Coordsen amendment as amended to LB 924. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Mr. Clerk, please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment as amended.

SENATOR WILL: The Coordsen amendment is adopted. Next item on LB 924, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: The next amendment is offered by Senator Hillman. This is AM3844, Senator, found on page 1134.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Hillman, you are recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I've had several discussions off of the floor with different entities that have some concern about the size and how well it would be able to facilitate the kinds of answers that we're trying to get. Would there be some kind of a bottleneck or would it actually delay any of the projects we're looking at? And that's not the intent of the commission nor the council's at all. So what this language does is it talks about the intent of not only what LB 924 would do but it also talks about the intent of what it would not do. And that if we look at the provisions, they're not intended to impede the rapid deployment of appropriate technology or establish cumbersome regulations or bureaucracy. And looking at the evaluation component later on we'll talk about, this is one of the things that would coincide with the evaluation component and would want members to understand that it will be definitely in front of the commission and the
