First he wooed her, then he won here. And she lost her maiden name. It's the same the whole world over. It's the poor what gets the blame. It's the rich what gets the gravy. Ain't it just a bloody shame? That's true. That came from the Mother country, England. Now if we apply that to the situation in this country, not just on taxation, but it is always the poor in this country who are made the scapegoats for every problem. Ronald Reagan has even said, if people were more righteous, they wouldn't be poor. They're poor because they're unrighteous. And he was hustling money every way that he could. His wife would borrow clothes and not give them back to those from whom she borrowed them. That's what these rich people do, the newly rich, those who are not accustomed to it. And what is being proposed here this evening is to take care of that particular group of people. I think any tax cut other than a sales tax cut is a waste of money. It shows not leadership, not vision, but pure politicking. If that amount of money which is available were to be spent on a project of worthiness, there would be something substantive to show for it. The relatively insignificant amounts that will be realized by the average person from this so-called tax cut will not even be noticed. When Senator Hillman told the anecdote about these people at this business summit claiming...claiming that they can't bring their business here because their employees say the income taxes are too high, they don't even know what the income tax rate is in Nebraska. The man who told her that was a liar. He was lying through his teeth. How many of you think that when these companies move from Nebraska to another state, the people in Nebraska say, well, I might not go to Pennsylvania because of the income tax rate. They tell these lies because people in the Nebraska Legislature will swallow anything. That is one of the most preposterous stories that I've heard them weave yet. They wouldn't tell me something like that. When these businesses decide to go to a location, it's for none of the reasons that are talked about to us. They tell us that so that they can rob the public till. But if Caterpillar comes here...Senator Brown wanted to make a little wager with me about whether they would come. I'm going to make it light on her. I'll bet her a dollar against a donut that Caterpillar does not come to Sarpy County. Even though Sarpy "Countians" or "Sarpites" or whatever they're called, "homo-sarpians" have bought some land, that doesn't mean they're going to come here. That's another one of those things
