PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Tyson.
Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Thank you, Madam President. I have a question
for Senator Maurstad, please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR ROBAK: Senator Maurstad,...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Yes.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...how does this Amendment 4189, which is
LB 1102 I believe, how does that change the current stalking
bill...stalking law right now?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: It makes the current stalking or harassment a
separate section in the statute so it separates it out from
domestic abuse. Other than that, the provisions are the same as
what they would...

SENATOR ROBAK: The same as they are...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Um-hum.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...the same as they are right now...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Um-hum.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...without your bill?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: That's my understanding and Senator Brashear
can correct me if I'm wrong.

SENATOR ROBAK: I was...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: But it's pulling it out and making it
separate.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay, I understand that you're dividing...we're
dividing it right there, but I was wondering now do the stalking
victims, if they are...do they need a protection order?
