So even in the story, they misled the children. But, nevertheless, those who can spin straw into gold are not saddled with the worry of those of us who don't have an inexhaustible supply of money and who do not have the ability to turn base metal into gold or even to find money coined and minted by the Unites States in inexhaustible supply. So when you have a limited amount of money, and after you spend it, you may not be able to replenish the source, you should be watchful and careful of how you spend it. In this case, the counties have not been careful, the state has not been careful. I don't even hear Squire Wehrbein worrying about this expenditure of money. Spending money year after year supposedly for a problem, but the problem not only does not go away, it it not even mitigated. But, nevertheless, it was many, many years ago, and they, then, were talking about children killing children, children disobeying their parents, and if you carry it way back to the time when they wrote in the Old Testament, they were writing about children doing the same thing. So for some reason it is not an issue of children not learning, adults apparently never learn how to properly deal with and treat their children. So we have the same problems repeated generation after generation, and it's going to continue to be that way when there is a financial incentive for it. And my time is probably up, but I will turn my light on.
