LB 124 provides that railroad cars and other rolling stock shall not block any public highway, street or alley, within a city of the primary class for more than ten minutes. The fine for violation of this provision is set at not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$10,000. All fines are to be deposited into the Permanent School Fund.

The actual amount of fine revenue deposited into the Permanent School Fund will depend on the number of violations and the amount of the fine, which can be set within a range of \$1,000 to \$10,000. Investment income from the Permanent School Fund is distributed to school districts throughout the state.
