A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act; to
2 amend section 60-483, Reissue Revised Statutes of
3 Nebraska; to change powers and duties of the Director of
4 Motor Vehicles; and to repeal the original section.
5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 60-483, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 60-483. (1) The director shall assign a distinguishing
4 number to each operator's license issued and shall keep a record of
5 the same which shall be open to public inspection by any person
6 requesting inspection of such record who qualifies under section
7 60-2906 or 60-2907. Any person requesting such driver record
8 information shall furnish to the Department of Motor Vehicles (a)
9 verification of identity and purpose that the requester is entitled
10 under section 60-2906 or 60-2907 to disclosure of the personal
11 information in the record, (b) the name of the person whose record
12 is being requested, and (c) when the name alone is insufficient to
13 identify the correct record, the department may request additional
14 identifying information. The department shall, upon request of any
15 requester, furnish a certified abstract of the operating record of
16 any person and shall charge the requester a fee of three dollars
17 per abstract. The department shall remit any revenue generated
18 under this section to the State Treasurer, and the State Treasurer
19 shall credit eight and one-third percent to the Department of Motor
20 Vehicles Cash Fund, fifty-eight and one-third percent to the
21 General Fund, and thirty-three and one-third percent to the Records
22 Management Cash Fund.

23 (2) The director shall, upon receiving a request and an
24 agreement from the United States Selective Service System to comply
25 with requirements of this section, furnish driver record
26 information to the United States Selective Service System to
27 include the name, post office address, date of birth, sex, and
28 social security number of licensees. The United States Selective

1 Service System shall pay all costs incurred by the department in
2 providing the information but shall not be required to pay any
3 other fee required by law for information. No driver record
4 information shall be furnished to the United States Selective
5 Service System regarding any female, nor regarding any male other
6 than those between the ages of seventeen years and twenty-six
7 years. The information shall only be used in the fulfillment of
8 the required duties of the United States Selective Service System
9 and shall not be furnished to any other person.

10 (3) The director shall keep a record of all applications
11 for operators' licenses that are disapproved with a brief statement
12 of the reason for disapproval of the application.

13 (4) The director may provide a monitoring service which
14 provides information on operator records that have changed due to
15 any adjudicated traffic citation or administrative action. The
16 director shall charge a fee of six cents per operator record
17 searched pursuant to this section and the fee provided in
18 subsection (1) of this section for each driver's abstract returned
19 as a result of the search. enter into an agreement with any person
20 to provide the person information regarding adjudicated traffic
21 citations or administrative actions from the records produced for
22 or developed by the department for purposes related to maintenance
23 of the driver record information data base. The agreement may
24 determine the periodic basis, cost, and media on which the
25 information will be provided.
