and say to me, well, what happens if I have great athletic teams and everybody wins? So what? No, what happens is that that's...if this is in the rule, you will wind up suspending the rule. If you don't like eight, now is the time to make the change. These do not apply to amendments to the constitution, which are resolutions. So when you see a constitutional amendment, it's Legislative Resolution 1, and then after it you will see a CA; that's Constitutional Amendment. Those don't count towards the eight. They do not also count towards interim study resolutions that we'll do towards the end of this session. However, what it does cover are resolutions to the federal government, and resolutions memorializing Congress. So if there is some changes that you want to have, those types of things would be included in the eight. Now why do I do the eight? That's...that comes into play on the second portion that we're going to debate in a little bit, and that is that if these things are congratulatory or express our condolence of the Legislature, they are going to be presumed adopted if they've been in the Journal for five days. If somebody objects, then they can be debated. If not, they'll be designated after five days. They'll just be presumed adopted by the Legislature. You can do your resolution. You can have it printed up and sent out to whoever. It's a matter of trying to, I think, focus what we do on the floor of the Legislature. I think it...this has sort of been the progression that we've done over the years as we've gone from full debate on these, unlimited, and right now what we do is we have everybody introduce them and we have one big vote at the end to adopt all of them. This is just the next step into that and I would urge the adoption of this first portion of the rule change.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. To speak to this proposed rule change, Senator Crosby, please.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Just to start with, don't misunderstand anything I have to say today. I'm not emotional about this change in the rules. I'm simply not going to vote for either one of them. Senator Kristensen, I know that you're working at trying to tighten up the agenda, and we did something, it seems like, within the last two years to do that. We, instead of talking about each individual baseball team or football team, we put them all together. Then they
