CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of
LB 33.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: LB 33 is advanced to E & R Initial.
Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 34, by Senator Wickersham. (Read
title.) Bill was introduced on January 7, referred to Revenue,
advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill,
Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Chair recognizes
Senator Wickersham, to open on LB 34.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President. This is a bill
that was actually brought to us through the Revisor's Office.
It didn't quite qualify as a Revisor's bill because it actually
does something substantive rather than just purely cleaning up
the statutes. But, beyond that, I can tell you that, in my
opinion, it is absolutely technical, although it has substantive
effect. It does not change existing law. It conforms internal
references in the statutes so that they are appropriate within
the context of the statutes that are implementing, in one case,
a sales tax. They are...it is absolutely technical. It does
not change the law. It simply makes internal references conform
appropriately within the sections that are being referenced out.

The question before you is the advancement of LB 34 to E & R
Initial. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Record,
