PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Suttle.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Senator, on the fiscal note also my concern is that in later years will the revenue match the expenditures so we're not...so if they have a service or if they have this...this commission, they're funding that entity of it, we're not short like it shows here in the year 2000?

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes. It will be revenue neutral and, as more and more things, more and more operations are identified, those fees will be regulated and it will be...there will be a nail tech on the Cosmetology Board, so that will be watched carefully.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: And if the expenditure, this states here, is going to be about 40,000 salary or operating expense and then there's a salary and the per diem, the cosmetologists or the practitioners, whatever you call them here, will be taking...they'll pay that actual expense.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay.

SENATOR SUTTLE: Yes.

SENATOR SUTTLE: They will. It...it's...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay, thank you. Thank you.
