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SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: And if three people show up and two vote for it and one votes against it...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: No, you have to have 10 percent of the registered voters.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Oh, that's right. Yeah, right.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: You have to have a quorum of 10 percent of the registered voters.

SENATOR VRTISKA: So it takes 10 percent of the registered voters in that county in order to have an official election. That's...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: To have a quorum, to vote at all.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Right. Okay. That's what I wanted to make clear. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Seeing no further lights, Senator Wickersham, you are recognized to close on the amendment to the amendment. Senator Wickersham waives closing. The motion before us is the Wickersham amendment to the amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is adopted. Further discussion on the committee amendments? Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, "Mr. Wizard", if I understand correctly what's happening, these committee amendments will become the bill. Is that right?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.
