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CLERK: I have nothing further on the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Back to the discussion of the committee amendments then. Senator Beutler, your light is on.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Coordsen, Senator Bromm, let me ask just one more set of questions about the bill. And, while I'm thinking about it, that previous bill that had to do with state liability certificates of title, did you intend or not intend that certificates of title to mobile homes would be included under that?

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Beutler, the specific titles are listed in that bill, the sections referring to the specific titles. And I need to go back, I need to look at that quickly to tell you whether I intended for it to or not. (Laugh.) I don't think I did, because it wasn't...mobile home titles were never addressed in that discussion or the committee hearing, but I want to be sure. And so I will get you an answer to that just as quickly as I can.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And the last...and the last question the notice that's sent out, under this bill, is to the registered owner. And every place where there's a requirement for notice, it's always in the singular form. It's true, is it not, that a car could be registered in the name of a husband and wife, in the name of a father-son, mother-daughter, could be registered in the name of more than one person, correct?

SENATOR BROMM: Correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And in that situation, well two questions, I guess. Do you think the notice should go to all owners that are shown as registered owners? Or is it enough to send it to one? My concern is basically this, there may be a number of situations where you have an irresponsible owner, but another responsible owner. More likely than not in these situations a responsible parent, an irresponsible child, an irresponsible spouse, but the other spouse responsible, and the other party perhaps in need of the vehicle. And there are situations of
