SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Any further discussion on LB 100? Seeing none, Senator Pederson, you may close.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I would just appreciate the vote in favor of this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Pederson. You've heard the closing. The question is the advancement of LB 100 to E & R Initial. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Madam President.
