SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then all of the other dollar amounts in the bill, are those all dating from 1976?

SENATOR JANSSEN: All the rest of them, let's see here, we'll go through those. One is in...the \$2,000 figure was 1987, the one from 100 to 250 dollars was in 1976, the other one from 25 to 300 I think was also in 1976, yeah, and the last one, the 500 to...the filing for late...late filings of contributors was also in 1976

SENATOR BEUTLER: Seventy-six, okay. And then...

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's the oldest one and then the other, the first one, was from 1987, the 1,000 to 2,000...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...2,000 to 5,000, right, yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and then the only other question that I had, I noticed that those particular items we've gone through and updated for inflation and that kind of thing. On page 8 and on page 9 and again on...back later in the bill, there are also some fines; \$50 a day in another case, \$10 a day. I don't think those have been updated since 1976 either, have they?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Probably not, probably not.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I am wondering why the commission is interested in updating the one and not the other.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I really have no idea, Senator Beutler. This...this is what they felt was the most important. Part of it was for less paperwork, so...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right, okay, thank you, Senator.
