the amendment as filed simply...the wording could be interpreted to mean that tribes would get current funds, in addition to previous years' funds, when and if the tribe would decide to implement their own welfare reform. This eliminates that confusion by saying "after which", on line 2, just say...it will read, "to make state funds available to meet the needs of people living on tribal lands". I'm sorry, I didn't have a copy of the amendment in front of me, so...but that's what the amendment does. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: That's...okay, there are no lights on. Senator Bohlke, did you wish to say anything further on your amendment?

SENATOR BOHLKE: No.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Bohlke amendment to LB 475. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bohlke's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Bohlke amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator Smith.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I would move the advancement of LB 475 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Motion is to advance LB 475 to E & R. Those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (LB) 479, Senator Smith, I have no amendments to that bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Smith.
