CLERK: Senator Hilgert would move to amend, Mr. President. (See Hilgert amendment, AM0656, on page 840 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Hilgert, on your amendment.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. This amendment is fairly simple. If you remember, on General File we adopted an amendment that would also apply to the nurses, as well as physicians. Well, in the time between General and Select, the pharmacists realized that they would also like to be covered regarding the...because they're going to be asked to be, frankly, dispensing some of those controlled substances. The amendment rewrites Section 2, but the new language is just a matter of around a dozen words. We insert the words "or pharmacist licensed under the Uniform Licensing Law", and then "or dispenses". The numerical 71-1,142 to 71-1,147.61 is simply the Uniform Licensing Law for pharmacists. This amendment simply, basically just includes pharmacists in it. And that's all. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Hilgert. There are no other lights on. Did you wish to say anything in closing? Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Hilgert amendment to LB 226. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. We're voting on the Hilgert amendment. If you care to vote, please do so. We're voting on the Hilgert amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Hilgert's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Hilgert amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Smith, for a motion.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I would move the advancement of
