in medical school. He also went on to say, and his testimony was excellent so I do want to get a couple of these things into the record. He said, we have evidence from two large-term trials now, both type I and type II diabetes, there's definitive evidence that improved control makes a difference in decreasing complications. They've done studies on this. And he goes on to say every diabetic should see a dietician and a diabetic educator at their diagnosis. Ongoing education is necessary as their therapy changes. With that, I would thank you all for your attention to the matter this morning and urge your advan...urge the advancement of LB 99.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. The question before us is the advancement of LB 99. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 6...or LB 99, excuse me.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: LB 99 is advanced. Members, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 38. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. Revenue Committee reports (LB) 505 to General File with amendments; (LB) 605, General File with amendments. Natural Resources reports LR 31 back to the Legislature for further consideration, LB 389 to General File with amendments. Study resolutions: LR 45 and (LR) 46, by Senator Chris Peterson. They'll be referred to the Executive Board. And I have confirmation hearing reports from the Natural Resources Committee, two separate reports.

A couple of announcements, Mr. President. Agriculture Committee will meet in Executive Session in Room 2022 at eleven; Ag, 2022 at eleven. And Business and Labor will have a session, eleven-thirty, underneath the south balcony. That's all that I had, Mr. President. (See pages 968-978 of the Legislative Journal.)
