suggested to us by the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court was recently told by the State Auditor that it should be requiring county courts to charge sales tax on the cost of photocopies made for the public. While it is typical for the county courts across the state to charge the 25 cents per page, as allowed in Section 33-126.05, it is not practical for them to maintain a petty cash fund for the making of change if a sales tax were to be added as a cost. The amendment to the bill would include the sales tax in the 25-cent allowable charge and that would ease the collection process. The courts will collect the tax and remit it to the state, but this is an amendment that is requested for the convenience of the courts. I would urge the adoption of the amendment. We're simply facilitating a change here because it is germane. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN PRESIDING

SENATOR COORDSEN: Heard the motion to advance LB 51. Those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, (LB) 416. No E & R's, Senator Smith. Senator Beutler, I have from you, Senator, AM0727, with a note
