SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...swear something in court?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let...let me get away from all that other stuff.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let's deal with this bill and carrying a concealed weapon.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The purpose of this license that we're talking about, this application, is to get permission to carry a concealed weapon. Is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if you make a false statement, it's a Class IV felony.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's what the bill says.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now put that in box labeled A. Let's go to box labeled B. If I carry a concealed weapon, right now, it's a Class I misdemeanor.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why should I run the risk of making a false statement to get an application, when there is a lesser penalty if I just go on and carry a concealed weapon without all of this?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well I...Senator Chambers, if you could
