

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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I'm trying to coordinate or correlate what is in Senator Bromm's handout with what is in the committee amendments and then the green bill, and I haven't been too successful. So, Senator Bromm, what I am going to do is make reference to some pages on your handout, then you can assist me from that point, if you will. So my first question would go to page 3 of your handout, in the third box from the bottom, it's talking about something from LB 589 and, apparently, this is going to be an outright repeal of this section, 60-4,101. Is that correct? I'm asking Senator Bromm a question. Could he be turned on?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, Senator Bromm, I went to the section and it relates to people who are inmates in the Department of Correctional Services or in mental institutions, and it talks about what will be done with their license, records of whatever is done, and how this whole process is to be handled. Why is all of that being stricken?

SENATOR BROMM: What we were told by DMV as the reason for having this in there was that it was inconsistent with other statutes and that there was no...no reason to continue to have Section 60-4,101. I will ask them to give me, so I can respond to you, what other sections are in conflict with that, but that was the rationale, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was 589 a bill that DMV wanted introduced?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, that was a driver's license clean-up bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it was more or less taken on faith that what they said represented what really is in the bill and what it does?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, they certainly, yes, because they certainly originated the drafting.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, with all due respect to you and the committee, I'm not prepared to accept some of the
