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LB 131, 131A, 248

The second thing that it does, it prohibits the issuance of an explosive license to someone who has been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony, domestic violence, on the rationale that if you can't buy a firearm, and you cannot on that basis, you shouldn't also be allowed to buy the necessary elements for a bottle bomb, or for explosive materials. That is all that it does. And I ask that it be forwarded to Select. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on advancement of the bill? Senator Tyson, you're recognized to close. Waives closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 131 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 131.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (LB) 131 advances. LB 131A.

CLERK: (LB) 131A, by Senator Tyson. (Read title.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Tyson, you're recognized to open on the A bill.

SENATOR TYSON: The 131A bill is for \$10,000 for two years, a relatively minor sum that the State Patrol feels that they need to implement (LB) 131. I ask that it be advanced.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Debate on the A bill? Senator Tyson, you're recognized to close. He waives closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 131A to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 131A.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (LB) 131A advances. LB 248.

CLERK: (LB) 248, Mr. President, introduced by Senator Schimek. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to
