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that all youth receive appropriate services and placements, regardless of their families' resources. There would also be a provision that if the Office of Juvenile Services did not have physical space for the youth's placement, OJS would pay for the cost of detention instead of the counties until a space was available within the Office of Juvenile Services. Provisions from LB 472 are also included in the amendment. That bill transfers the secure youth confinement facility to the Office of Juvenile Services. LB 472 transfers the management and operation of the secure youth facility from the Department of Correctional Services to the Office of Juvenile Services within the Department of Health and Human Services. The effective date of the transfer is to be January 1, 2000. Several statutes are amended to make existing law conform to the intent of the bill. Several sections in Chapter 43 dealing with infants and juveniles, are amended in the area of the juvenile code, as are several in Chapter 83 dealing with the Department of Correctional Services. On the effective date of January 1, 2000, all buildings, equipment, fixtures and furnishings of the secure youth confinement facility shall be transferred. An interagency agreement shall be established between Corrections and Juvenile Services to efficiently transfer the management and operation as well as the population, who are juveniles tried as adults, with as little disruption as possible. The two agencies may also contract for support and security for these secure youth confinement facilities. This is a brief description of the committee amendment to LB 652 and Senator Brashear, if he were here, would be happy to answer any questions if he could. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you. Senator Chambers, you are the next recognized to speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, before this counts against me, are we going to leave this bill at 3:00 because I don't want to say a little bit and then we get off the bill?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, that's why I was a little bit hesitant in calling the next senator to speak because we do need to leave this bill and I was trying to determine what would be the best time to leave this bill.
