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only is desirable and feasible, but what ought to be done from the standpoint of our obligation as state officials. This amendment of Senator Thompson will strike language that was designed to transfer that juvenile prison in Omaha to Health and Human Services. That's all that her amendment will do. That which is being stricken was a bill that had been offered by Senator Dwite Pedersen. Senator Dwite Pedersen is in favor of striking that from the committee amendment, so there should be a "yes" vote. Then there are a couple of other elements in the committee amendments which will need some discussion. I'm not sure that I see eye to eye with those who are in support of those provisions. I want us to move toward the necessity of constructing a facility. It will not be under the Department of Corrections. It will be under that Office of Juvenile Services, or HHS, I get these letters mixed up now. I know my alphabet forward and backward, from any point starting, going forward or backward from that point, but when we start designating agencies and subagencies by their initials I'm kind of lost, but most people who followed the discussion know what it is to which I'm referring. We will push toward constructing a facility. Right now, you can draw in your mind three categories of youngsters who are going to be under the custody of the state or in the custody of the state; those who have been sentenced to that youth prison in Omaha. It is a prison just like the penitentiary except young people are there. There is another group at the other end of the spectrum who wind up at Geneva and Kearney, Geneva for the females, Kearney for the males. They require some kind of custodial handling but nowhere near that which is found at the prison. The middle group are not to be sent to Kearney and Geneva because they require a tighter custodial care than those two places provide but nowhere near the custodial control found at the prison. So rather than have that prison in the equation at all, we're getting rid of that. The facility that would be constructed is the one we will wind up discussing and that's one...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...which I think could be designed in such a way that children who currently go to Geneva and Kearney could go to this facility where there will be children who require somewhat more in the way of custodial care but not the prison.
