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SENATOR CHAMBERS: So that's 100 percent. Where do the retailers come in?

SENATOR JANSSEN: They were to get 5 percent.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Where does it say that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That was established in the regulations.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There is nothing in the statute that entitles them to anything, though, is there?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Don't believe so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you're changing that situation by putting this...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Putting it...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...amount into the statute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Isn't that true?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the way your amendment reads, that amount of 6 percent is a floor. It can be raised higher than that. Retailers can be paid more than that under your amendment, isn't that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That would be true, could be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now under my version of the amendment, that 6 percent would be the maximum they could receive. Isn't that true?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That would be true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what you want to do is leave it open so that retailers, if they can bring pressure to bear...let me ask
