SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...it is saying they cannot get more than 6 percent. They're the ones who put this kind of rule in the game before. Now they don't want the corollary to that rule. It's all right to have one where they win all the time, they'll always get 6 percent no matter what. But if there happens to be an upturn, they can get more than 6 percent. But they don't want a situation where they will ever fall below 6 percent no matter what the condition of lottery ticket sales would happen to be. Madam President, I'm going to ask for a call of the house, and I will accept then a machine vote.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: You've heard a motion for a call of the house. All of those in favor vote aye, all in favor (sic) vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, to place the house under call.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The house is under call. Will all unauthorized people leave the floor. Will all members return to the Chamber and check in, please. Senators Hudkins, Kristensen and Vrtiska, would you please return to the floor. Senators Hartnett and Robak. Senators Quandahl and Dwite Pedersen, please return to the Chamber. Senators Quandahl and Robak, would you please return to the Chamber, the house is under call. Senator Chambers, I understand we have had no live sighting of Senator Robak. Would you like to proceed. All right. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the committee amendment. All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 6 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments.
