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PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bourne, you're recognized to open on your motion.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Landis indicated that there wasn't an opposition. Well, obviously I'm in opposition. The bill did go through on General without any...well, with one opposing vote. I just move to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Janssen, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, and esteemed colleagues. I guess, yes, I would...I would support his motion to overrule the Chair, and I might add a few more things if I could while we're on this. It doesn't pertain to the motion to overrule the Chair, but this is a discretionary measure for the retailer to either have someone sign the book or not sign it. And why wouldn't he want someone to sign that book? The reason for that is it gets him off the hook if he signs...if they sign the book. But I don't want to take up any more time. I don't believe that this is the bill for Senator Landis to try to amend. It's been here before and if it would...he would introduce the bill again in General Affairs Committee, it would get a hearing and possibly be moved to the floor. With that, thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Landis, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. And it allows...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, your point?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is the longest 15 minutes on history that I've reckoned. How long has...have we spent on this bill?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Fourteen minutes and 25 seconds.
