Tyson's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Tyson would move to amend with AM1163. (AM1163, Legislative Journal page 1382.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Mr. President, members of the body, AM1163 does only one thing. It removes a single word, "any," from the definition of a destructive device, so that instead of reading "bottle bomb or any vessel or container intentionally..." and so forth, we strike "any" and it's "any bottle bomb or vessel." That's all that it does. It merely tightens the language a little bit for reasons that, quite frankly, I don't understand. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Seeing no lights, you're recognized to close. Senator Tyson waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Tyson amendment to LB 131. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Tyson's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The Tyson amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 131 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is the advancement of LB 131. Those in favor vote aye, say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: LB 131A, Senator Smith. I have no amendments to that bill.
