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atrocious form?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Absolutely, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Now we know what his standards of quality legislating are. (laugh) Members of the legislature, the committee is going to say it put an atrocious bill out here because it had to, but I, Senator Robak, and young Senator Bourne voted against doing that. That's not responsible. Now the committee...now the Legislature may follow what Senator Kristensen seemed to be hinting at, and that's to now pass a bad bill and then wash our hands like Pilate, and say I have nothing to do with the blood of this just man. That's what Pilate said. We'll say, I have nothing to do with this bad bill and we will not add, which could not have become law had we not voted it into law. There is no way we can get out from under our responsibility. And I'm going to have fun, if you vote against...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the motion, watching you try to work your way through this bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, for discussion on the bracket motion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Question. Question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. I didn't hear you. The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. Question before us is, should debate cease? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. The question is, shall debate cease? Have you all voted? Senator Brown, for what purpose do you rise?
