SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR KIEL: ...as well as environmental benefits. And I would urge my colleagues to vote to move this bill to Select File. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate on advancement? Senator Kiel waives closing. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 829 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 829.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: LB 829 advances. Items for the record.

CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. Enrollment and Review...I'm sorry, strike that. Urban Affairs Committee reports LB 105 to General File with amendments attached; and Senator Brown, an amendment to be printed to LB 637. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal page 1545.)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you. LB 76.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 76, introduced by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 7, referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have Judiciary Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on 76.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is a unique moment in the Legislature's proceedings, there are many unique events associated with it. When I and the Pope are just like that, that is unique. He and I see doing away with the death penalty the same way. When the "Silver Fox", who is a death penalty proponent, and I, whom am a death penalty opponent, are just like that, that is unique.
