SENATOR DIERKS: The only thing that's in that amendment is the date that it takes place.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, Senator Dierks, the federal government could require less in the way of reporting than LB 835 requires. Do you agree with that?

SENATOR DIERKS: That is true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, if that turns out to be the case, then on February 15th, the terms...would the terms of LB 835 kick in?

SENATOR DIERKS: That's my...that's my impression, it does.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can you show me where there is anything which says that the federal government has to act or not act?

SENATOR DIERKS: Not in my bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. So we don't even need to look at them. If the federal government acts and puts in place exactly what we have in this bill, then what is in this bill would still take effect February 15th. Is that true?

SENATOR DIERKS: That's true, except the part for the packer feeding, which would take effect, because of the E clause, upon signing of the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, I'm just talking about the reporting.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay. That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Who drafted the amendment that went up there for the...just the date delay on the reporting?

SENATOR DIERKS: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: I believe that's right. Now, wait,...
