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think there is some need to discuss this. There...where we're starting now is the move of bills that, in fact, are unanimous consent bills out of committee that aren't...that are jumping over General File. I've got one myself. My suggestion is that with some announcement to the body of this kind of concern and some chance to work it out here, it's possible that on a consent calendar day if there was another consent calendar day, we could get to bills like this and have a General File debate or discussion. So I want to...I want to endorse one thing here and that is that there is a problem with uninsured drivers in this state driving, being in accidents, and leaving people with injuries for which there is no form of support other than falling back on the welfare system, and that's...that's a shame. We ought to be able to do better. I'm not exactly sure how to do better. If I knew how to do better, I'd introduce a bill and I don't. So the idea of a commission searching for ideas is not a bad idea. I applaud Senator Peterson on that. I do think there's a problem and that is that we have a lot of good ideas that aren't going to get the light of the day. My suggestion is that if you're like me and you have a couple of bills that are out, maybe we could meet with the Speaker and ask for another consent calendar day and maybe some of these things can be worked out and moved on a General File debate. I think that's probably the appropriate place for this to be handled as opposed to this amendment. Thank you.
